Dear sirs,

I am applying to erect a lean to type hay shed at Deer Park Farm, Fylingthorpe (near to Fyling Park Farm). The shed will be dark grey box profile sheets and larch yorkshire boarding to match the building that was erected in 2017. It will be approximately one meter below ground level.

I need the shed to store hay and straw in.

As you can see from the enclosed photograph, we are having to use plastic wrap on the haylage bales. This is a practice that I want to stop, I need not explain why with all the T V coverage that single use plastic is getting.

I want to switch to making hay because at Deer Park Farm we are an upland holding and I firmly believe that if there is to be any support for agriculture in the uplands in future it will involve making hay on our meadows in similar schemes to the ones that are running at present in the Yorkshire Dales hay meadows scheme. A shed is a must to store hay in, to stop it wasting in the winter.

I think that a shed of similar materials to the existing one will be far more pleasing to the eye and a far greater asset to the area than the present hotch potch of plastic wrap. I have planted trees around the other building and will plant them round the new one as soon as is practical. As you can see from the photograph it is well shielded with trees on the North side and I hope in future years we will have trees and bushes forming screening on the other sides.
