Boundary Fence, Land rear of Fairfield Way, Whitby
Ref: NYM/2019/0260/FL

Further to your letter requesting a 'Tree Survey' to accompany this application, I set out below details which we hope will satisfy this requirement.

The new boundary fence will skirt the area of trees noted as indicated on drawing no. D10938-10C. The fence proposed is to be a steel palistrade type fence with posts at approximately 2m intervals.

These post holes will be the only excavation required, consisting of individual holes approximately 400mm wide and at 2m crs for the concrete post bases. Damage to roots will be isolated and not widespread. The vast majority of tree roots will be totally unaffected.

The fence type will also allow light and rain to pass between the palistrade, again without affecting the trees.

Once erected the fence will form a protective barrier to the woodland, ensuring long term protection.
