#### Dear Hilary

I have looked at this one immediately as I am off on holiday tomorrow.

The survey by Wold Ecology is thorough and includes an emergence and re-entry survey in June and July. The report shows that the buildings are in good habitat but are not used by roosting bats. There is a common pipistrelle roost in the neighbouring farmhouse and 10 bats were seen emerging. I would recommend that the Method Statement at page 22-25 of the report is conditioned as bats may make use of the buildings and there is a bat roost very close by so lighting design needs to be considered.

I will copy in Laura Hobbs in case there are any queries. Laura will be able to deal with bat cases while I am away.

Morning Harriet,

In addition to Sara's comment regarding bats, the ecological appraisal noted bird nests within the structures during the survey. Whilst the species using these was not identified, it would be appropriate for mitigation in the form of bird bricks incorporated into the structure or a number of bird boxes external to the building to be provided. The applicants ecologist will be able to advise on what would be most appropriate and suitable siting locations. If swallows have used the barn for nesting, then the applicant should ensure that alternative open sided buildings/structures remain available within the farm curtilage to provide alternative nesting locations.

It is not specified whether guttering will be provided and if so whether these will be directed into the mains or to a soakaway/surface water. If the latter, the applicant must ensure that this is directed away from the farmyard to the north west to prevent it from picking up contaminants.
