Thanks for the below.

After talking to Elspeth points as follow:

We are looking at Belted Galloways as we have had grazing for the last couple of years and will not winter them inside.

As Elspeth suggests for lambing the numbers will be very small and we would make A Midden for the straw waste which we envisage being minimal well away from the water course and then spread it later. The spreading would only be carried out when the land is not frozen or a frost anticipated within 48 hours of spreading and not when the land is sodden inline with good practice.

The fire pond has a separate drain around the whole perimeter to prevent run off from surrounding land . Also all run off from the roofs will be filtered through a fine mesh before entering the pond.

I hope this fully answers the issue, but please let me know if you need anything else.

Dear Hilary,

I have no objection to the site of the proposed lean-to and diverting surface water to the new fire pond (to be built) is acceptable.

It is detailed in the supporting agricultural information that the shed will be for lambing and wintering cattle in addition to general storage. This being the case it would be helpful if the applicant could clarify how they intend to deal with waste that arises from this use. I would assume given the relatively low stock numbers that bedding on straw (or other material) is proposed rather than a slatted system or alternative, however this will need to be confirmed along with information on where waste material will be stored when the shed is cleaned out and how they will ensure dirty water doesn't enter the fire pond or any other waterbody/watercourse.
