## Design and Assess Statement

Application for an access track for Dairy Cows and machinery to service a block of 175 acres of land.

The use of this track will reduce the need for the cows to walk long distances along the public highway, so minimising the obstruction to vehicles along the village roads. Slurry along the highway will also be greatly reduced.

The concrete sleepers have been positioned on an existing track, this will allow extended access to grazing pasture and reduce poaching and rutting by cows and tractors, hence reducing soil erosion and silting of streams.

Green artificial grass has been used to minimise visual impact, also to give a cushioning effect for the cow's feet, so improving welfare.

The track uses existing gateways to access the highway so no changes are needed,
