This letter represents Natural England's response to the Phase 12 condition discharge consultation. We have comments to make on the following conditions.

Discharge of planning conditions NYMNP 45, 46 and 47 Hydrological Risk Assessment

Natural England notes the information provided in document 40-FWS-WS-70-WM-RA-0014 (Hydrological Risk Assessment NYMNPA 45, 46 and 47 – Phase 12) and is satisfied with the conclusions regarding the impact of Phase 12 works on adjacent North York Moors SPA/SAC and SSSI habitats and species.

However we note that further monitoring and habitat evidence is being gathered by the applicant concerning the vulnerability of adjacent habitats and hydrological impacts of the works and would welcome this additional information regarding hydrological risk at the next phase of the project. We would particularly welcome clarification regarding the trigger points for additional mitigation measures.

Hi Rob,

I have looked at the documents submitted with this application, which for the most part are concerned with ground water issues , which I presume the Environment Agency will comment on. However there is a submission relating to the noise assessment which affects both the above ground constructions and blasting operations. The real impact of blasting is not yet known and relies on trial blasts to 'get it right' i.e. to ensure compliance with the noise and vibration limits previously set. Ideally it would have been helpful to attend such trials but in the light of Covid 19 this might not be practicable or appropriate. If it is carried out after lockdown is lifted , I would suggest a condition that such testing is witnessed independently by specialists and accompanied by yourselves or ourselves. Notwithstanding that, a report should be provided to yourselves following such tests by an independent noise/vibration specialist, which shall specify a vibration management methodology which specifies the type, timings and impact of blasting necessary to comply with the limits previously conditioned.
