Complete essential re-roofing of Avery house, using "like for like" hand made pan tiles, to ensure waterproofing and integrity of the building.

1. Strip existing pan tiles from the roof.
2. Review condition of existing pan tiles and retain as many as possible that can be re-used. Clean using soapy water and non-abrasive sponge.
3. Re-used (where possible) & new hand made clay tiles to be fitted to existing wooden battons.
4. Coping stones to be removed to allow for lead flashing.
5. New lead flashing fitted to gable wall.
6. Coping stones re-bedded on new lead flashing.

Jack Pearse Building Contractors (Whitby), has been engaged to execute the works once approval has been obtained, due to their specialist knowledge on techniques and materials required to comply with National Parks Standards.

## 7. Grounds for Application

Please state why you consider that a Certificate of Lawfulness of Proposed Works should be granted for these works i.e. why they do not require listed building consent and will not affect the character of the listed building as a building of special architectural or historic interest:

The building subject to works, has traditional red hand made clay pan tiles, that are archetypal to the fishermen's cottages of Robin Hoods Bay and help to create the unique character of the village. To protect the character, we will re-use as many of the current tiles as possible. For replacements, we will source, equivalent hand made clay pan tiles (product name - William Bylth Barco) from William Blyth handmade tiles & Pottery. We compared a number of samples in order to find the best colour match. We have sourced a local roofing company, with extensive experience re-roofing grade 2, listed buildings in the area, and are familiar with working with this traditional material and following the National Parks standards. Works are essential due to poor state of the roof.
