Dear Mr Barker,

Thank you for your email and for confirming that you are happy to use the Fineo glass within the replacement windows.

As previously discussed, the replacement window frames should be an accurate copy of the existing and therefore in order to progress the application without a site visit, I would be grateful to receive detailed drawings of the existing windows supported by internal photos of the windows. The details contained within these drawings and photos should be used to inform the design of the replacement window frames.

As there are currently a variety of window styles within the front elevation of the property, either of the following options would be acceptable:

• Each replacement window would be an accurate copy of the window it is replacing. Or:

• All 7 no. windows would be designed to replicate the details of the 2 no. ground floor windows on the south (right hand side) of the property as these are the oldest windows within the property.

I would be grateful to receive revised drawings indicating the design, detailing, finish and sectional details of the replacement windows. As advised within the Committee meeting, these drawings should indicate how the windows will sit within the reveal so that the Authority can assess the bulk of the frame. Any new window should be an accurate copy in terms of dimensions, mouldings and placement.
