Single Horse Chestnut tree (T1) in the front garden of Woodleigh House.

Tree Condition;

- The stem bifurcates at 2m becoming 3 co-dominant stems. The union between the stems is acute but reasonable with no evidence of cracking or failure.
- At 4m a sub-dominant scaffold limb crosses over a larger stem to the north. This crossing stem may cause damage to the lower stem and become weakened by the ongoing incremental growth of both stems.
 Within the crown of the tree a moderate amount of deadwood was noted and the crown is now extending to within a metre of the adjacent building.
