Re: Window's.

The omission of the small central top opening section to W1 and W2 is welcomed for a much simpler 3 light casement.

With regards to W4 and W5 the details appear to show mock sashes? These two windows appear to be traditional sashes and as such should be replaced on a like for like basis, albeit with DG and applied glazing bars.

My only other comment would be that the proportions of W6 would seem to lend itself better to a side hung casement design, rather than sash because of its more horizontal appearance.

I have no comment to make on the windows to the eastern elevation.

Increased reveals would be a huge improvement so please condition reveals to be minimum of 50mm. Also please condition no external trickle vents.

Dear Megan

The extent of new glazing, which includes the replacement of the existing conservatory but the addition of a roof lantern, and a completely new glazed gable façade, is likely to significantly increase local light spill. Whilst the inclusion of a 600mm reveal is welcome to somewhat reduce light spill from the gable glazing into the night sky, and the garden is at present relatively well screened to reduce the likelihood of spill across the valley (although this screening could be removed by the applicant without planning consent), there will still be significant lateral spill which could have deleterious impacts on use of the nearby patchwork of trees and hedges by nocturnal species such as bats and owls. I would therefore recommend a reduction in new glazing, or if this is not possible then consideration of the inclusion of glazing films to minimise internal light spillage.

If approved, please can bat and bird informatives be included in the decision notice, and the inclusion of an external lighting condition.
