That any temporary installation has sufficient sound proofing in place to stop the noise of equipment running 24/7 sounding like "a refrigerated lorry is parked with its generators running" when you come outside the house, the fact that the installation is on a moor top does not preclude sound travelling in certain weather conditions and causing nuisance. That over the time of the works the road is kept clean and free of debris, including the roadside layby and that the current 5mph is adhered to and current traffic calming is kept in place due to the usage of the track.

Dear Mr Hill,

Thank you for your letter dated 23 September 2021 regarding a planning application and asking for our comments regarding this application.

I have assumed you are referring to the temporary Arqiva TV transmitter that has already been build in the site of an old quarry close to the fire damaged permanent Bilsdale transmitter and not with regard to a planned Cellnex mast that will provide mobile phone coverage.

Even though we live on the private access road to the transmitters and expect some disruption, we have no objections to the application. It is our view that it is important for people who have lost services to get their TV reception back as soon as possible. This is particularly important for elderly people that have suffered enough during the current Covid pandemic. The site of this mast is remote with existing access and to our mind is in an ideal location.

We hope the North York Moors National Park Authority do all they can to speed up the approval process.
