Good morning Jill,

The proposal details a substantial amount of additional external lighting will be implemented. I am mindful that although the site is in reasonably proximity to Scarborough and so the impacts on dark skies qualities will be less pronounced, it is shielded by the woodland to the east, and elsewise surrounded by arable land. The use of downlights/cowls/hoods, and LED bulbs of <3000k etc. could be included to minimise the light spill to preserve the local dark night sky quality.

Additionally, I note that the planting plan identifies several non-native trees will be replanted. Where possible, we recommend that any new planting should be of native species and local stock.

## Hi Jill

Looking at this proposal, the number of lights seems excessive and I can't see where the model/specification (colour temperature, OULR, lumens output etc) is detailed? I may have also missed what controls are in place to limit the periods the lights are lit.

I count 29 wall lights plus the 6 Victorian lamp posts. Unless they can reduce the number, I suggest we request a professional lighting design to justify the amount of light needed.

For example the carriage style down lights on our list of suggested fixtures will spread effective light 6-7m in either direction but I can't get an idea of scale from the supporting information drawing to determine what a more reasonable number of lights would be.

It is perfectly acceptable to have one by each access doorway and to light walkways but in some areas (eg near lamp post 1 and 4) it looks like there are 4 lights around an entrance when 2 would suffice especially when there are lampposts nearby. Also on long runs (presumably walkways) there are 4 or 5 lights when a lower number of lights should suffice. If the applicant is at all uncertain about reducing the number of lights then they should have a lighting design produced by a professional lighting engineer showing photometry data which would detail light levels sufficient for walkways and doorways.

On the subject of the lamp posts, are they for aesthetic purposes or serving some function such as lighting parking areas? If the latter then there are more sensitive ways of lighting parking areas.

I would be happy to advise further if required.
