### Note to the Planning Officer:

In assessing the submitted proposals and reaching its recommendation the Local Highway Authority has taken into account the following matters:

From the details included within the application, the use of the track is no greater than what is already permitted through the gated field access between the highway and the applicants fields. The existing verge crossing is not up to the current standard but as the proposals are not expected to increase the use from what is already permitted, the LHA are not recommending a planning condition to change the verge. This planning application does not permit the applicant to carry out any works within the highway verge. The LHA point out that it is an offence to drag mud or loose material out onto the highway and would suggest, due to the type of traffic and the gradient, that no loose material is placed within 3 metres of the back of the gate on the highway boundary that can be drawn onto the public highway.

The existing gate was observed as opening out over the highway verge. The applicant should be aware that this is an offence and that the gate is altered so that this does not continue.

Consequently the Local Highway Authority recommends that the following **Informative** is attached to any permission granted:
