I have just found this planning application on the planning portal and am wondering why I was not informed of it as I am one of the nearest neighbours to the site in question at LawnsGate and also share a natural spring water supply with them? I am therefore aware that because I was not notified I have missed the deadline for comments. I would however urge you to investigate the impact on the natural spring of the water usage of this site. Since the caravan park opened at LawnsGate plus the holiday lets and the hot tubs I've been told they now have, I have been having trouble with water pressure (sometimes my bathroom does not get enough water to run the taps or flush the toilet) and air in the water because LawnsGate are using it all. This water system was set up to provide water for 4 residential properties and we all pay 1/4 each for its upkeep; it was not set up to run a holiday park. I believe that allowing the expansion of this site will leave me permanently without water.
