Work to trees protected by TPO 1963/27 Egton Bridge

I refer to your application dated 8 June 2022 to carry out work to trees protected by the above Tree Preservation Order.

I can now confirm that the North York Moors National Park Authority consents to the following work:

W1	<p>Crown lift as required by up to a maximum of 6 metres of all edge trees along the southern boundary of TPO area W1 where it adjoins Station House.</p> <p>Remove large limb on the single oak along the same boundary.</p>
<p>Reason for consent – The work is reasonably required to prevent the lower parts of tree crowns becoming a nuisance, and reduce in some cases the possibility of branch fractures.</p>	

This permission is subject to the following conditions:

- That all tree works shall be carried out in accordance with British Standard 3998:2010, Tree Work- Recommendations;
- That work shall be carried out within a period of two years from the date of this letter (or else a new and separate application will be necessary).
