Note: crown lifting over the highway will be 5.2m over the public highway and 2.4m over the highway verge. Tree numbering runs north to south.			
Reason for consent – Works are reasonably required in the interests of tree and highway safety.			

As stated in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas), the above permission is subject to a six week notification period, with the details recorded in a register open to public inspection. This six week period from the date of notification has now elapsed and therefore the works noted above can be carried out at your earliest convenience within a period of two years and without further reference to myself.
