Information relating to appeal reference: APP/W9500/W/22/3308341

In relation to the above referenced appeal by Egton and Mulgrave Estates I wish to provide additional information against this appeal. The planning application was unanimously refused by the North York Moors National Park Authority on a number of extremely solid grounds. As a resident of the village, I would like to add that the site in question is extremely prominent and highly visible within the National Park. The imposition of an industrial estate and a row of suburban style houses is totally inappropriate and against all National Park policy. If this appeal were to be granted, then the government might as well abandon the whole national park apparatus as the respective authority's ability to protect the unique nature of the twelve National Parks in England and Wales would be fatally undermined.

Sir Arthur Hobhouse when he chaired the National Parks Committee, whose 1947 report led to the designation of the North York Moors as a national park, stated that the proposed park:

"Contains, within a relatively small compass, an amazing wealth and variety of beauty. Indeed, there are few places elsewhere in Britain which can offer such extensive and remote tracts of wild and unspoilt scenery within such easy reach of populated areas."

It is beholden upon yourselves to support the planning authority in their role of protecting the National Park against such harmful and sporadic development. Permitting the appellants to use their financial muscle and the influence of the Most Hon. the Marquess of Normanby to overturn this planning refusal will open the floodgates to more inappropriate and destructive development whose sole purpose is financial gain, contributing nothing to the character and future sustainability of the National Park.
