Thank you for the notification of your intention to carry out works to trees at Thorpe Hall which was received by this Office on 2 January 2023.

I can confirm that the North York Moors National Park Authority has no objection to the following works:

T2811 Copper Beech	Remove
T2812 Beech	Remove
T2814 Beech	Remove
T2816 Beech	Remove
T2802 and T2804 Turkey Oak	Removal of deadwood and areas of tip dieback. Crown lift up to 5.5m over highway (no notice required)
T2851 Bay	Crown reduction by up to 2m
T2848 Cider Gum	Remove
T2843 New Zealand Cabbage Palm	Remove

Reason for consent – Cabbage palm is non-native and makes limited contribution to conservation area. Cider Gum is a poor quality tree. The remaining trees have a range of defects that render them either a safety concern or unsuitable for long term retention in this location.

As stated in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas), the above permission is subject to a six week notification period, with the details recorded in a register open to public inspection. Therefore, after a six week period from the date of notification has elapsed (which would mean after 12 February 2023) subject to no objections being received, the work noted above may be carried out within a period of two years without further reference to myself.
