here is my reply to North York Moors National Park letter

starting at 2.1

the farm is very isolated as mentioned and can only be viewed at a distance from an unnamed road

4.7

the proposed windows would be in keeping with the main farmhouse which also has small pane windows, as far as a public benefit they are wrong, it improves our carbon footprint, which would be a public benefit.

4.8 4.9

the windows and doors would be joinery made and look exactly like the existing windows.

5.0

the planning application did not go to full planning and was decided without me being able to make my case in person, also i don't think they took into account how isolated Demesne Farm is Historic England

1

i believe that what we propose is as close to the originals as we can get while adding double glazing, replacing them with large picture windows as they want would be further from existing.

2

some windows are beyond repair, but are also single glazed

3

windows were only fitted some 18 years ago (approx) so have no historic value.

6.0

the stick on bars look exactly like the width of the existing bars, and are of very good quality, the wood is expected to last 50 years

6.5

as stated before some windows are beyond repair, and have been repaired several times.

6.6

large picture windows would look completely out of place, and what I propose is as close to existing as we can get, I understand large picture windows might look in keeping with some conversions, but not here at Demesne Farm built in 1780

finally 7.0

as mentioned before the public benefit would be saving on heating and the fact that the windows are expected to have a life span of 50 years

happy it compliy with the conditions in appendix 1.
