Concerns re application -

General appearance - the mast is higher and more conspicuous than other street furniture. A lot of money has been spent on this area of Staithes to develop it and make it more attractive to locals and visitors and placing a mast here will certainly detract from that. A 17.5 metre high mast is certainly not going to be hidden by the “screening provided by the surrounding built form and local topography” and will be visible from a great distance - not a great welcome to our beautiful village.

The proximity of the mast to houses, the children`s playground and the Gateway Centre. Proposed sites have been discounted due to being near to houses. There are houses near this site - why is this site any different? People have objected in other areas of Staithes and it just gets moved near to other houses,

This application singles out Staithes Caravan Park (which is not a touring site) in particular as being in need of better reception - is there any specific reason for this?

Local people do understand why tourism is vital to Staithes but this appears to be a development specifically aimed at smartphone reception for visitors whilst residents are the ones who would have to live near and see the mast every day. Surely NYMNP should try to balance the needs and wishes of locals and visitors.
