### **Note to the Planning Officer:**

In assessing the submitted proposals and reaching its recommendation the Local Highway Authority has taken into account the following matters:

The design standard for a 4 bedroomed dwelling would be to provide 3 parking spaces. The design includes 2 spaces and a turning area but a third space can be included that will block the other two spaces. The proposed access is in a new location to the gate shown on the existing plans and therefore requires a new verge crossing to be constructed along with the closing off of the old one.

Consequently the Local Highway Authority recommends that the following **Conditions** are attached to any permission granted:

1. MHC-03 New and altered Private Access or Verge Crossing at The Lilacs, West Barnby

The development must not be brought into use until the access to the site has been set out and constructed in accordance with the 'Specification for Housing and Industrial Estate Roads and Private Street Works" published by the Local Highway Authority and the following requirements:

The crossing of the highway verge must be constructed in accordance with the Standard Detail number E50A and the following requirements.

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- Any gates or barriers must not be able to swing over the existing highway.
- Provision to prevent surface water from the site/plot discharging onto the existing highway must be made and maintained thereafter to prevent such discharges.
- The final surfacing of any private access within one metre of the public highway must not contain any loose material that is capable of being drawn on to the existing public highway.

All works must accord with the approved details.

#### Reason for Condition

To ensure a satisfactory means of access to the site from the public highway in the interests of highway safety and the convenience of all highway users.

Notwithstanding any valid planning permission for works to amend the existing highway, you are advised that a separate licence will be required from North Yorkshire Council as the Local Highway Authority in order to allow any works in the existing public highway to be carried out. 3. MHC-05 Visibility Splays at The Lilacs, West Barnby

There must be no access or egress by any vehicles between the highway and the application site until splays are provided giving clear visibility of 33 metres measured along both channel lines of the major road from a point measured 2.4 metres down the centre line of the access road. In measuring the splays, the eye height must be 1.05 metres and the object height must be 1.05 metres. Once created, these visibility splays must be maintained clear of any obstruction and retained for their intended purpose at all times.
