Views of Low Newbiggin House and Farm





Background

Low Newbiggin House is a traditional and isolated farmstead set within the valleys at Aislaby, just above the North York Moors railway. The site comprises the main farmhouse, several converted outbuildings, and some traditional agricultural buildings.

Previous planning applications relate to the conversion of redundant outbuildings to form holiday cottages, the erection of a swimming pool building and subsequent discharges of condition.

This application seeks to install a flue within the most northerly agricultural building to facilitate a biomass boiler which will supply energy to the farmstead.

Planning permission is required because the flue exceeds the height of the building by 2m when then Permitted Development height limit above the height of the existing building is 1 m.

Main issues

Local policy context

The most relevant policies contained within the North York Moors Local Plan 2020 to consider with this application are Strategic Policy C (Design) and Policy C017 (Householder Development).

Strategic Policy C seeks to maintain and enhance the distinctive character of the National Park by considering siting, orientation, layout, and density of proposals in addition to appropriate scale, height and massing and form. Proposals should utilise good quality materials and be of a high-quality, sustainable design that reflects and complements the architectural character and form of the original building and/or that of the local vernacular.

Policy CO17 seeks to ensure that development within the domestic curtilage of dwellings should take full account of the character of the local area and the special qualities of the National Park. Development will only be permitted where: the scale, height, form, position, and design of new development no not detract from the character and form of the original dwelling and its setting; the development does not adversely affect the amenity for the existing and neighbouring occupiers; and that the development reflects the principles of the Authority's design guide.

Material considerations

The proposal seeks permission to install a flue within a current agricultural building which is to facilitate a new biomass boiler.

In view of Strategic Policy C and Policy CO17, the proposal includes a fairly tall flue to facilitate a large unit. However, the existing building and farmstead is isolated and the building in question is well screened by surrounding woodland. The most visible view is

from the trains which pass at the bottom of the valley. As such, it is considered that the principle of the flue is acceptable, and the applicant was advised that colouring it matt black would make it more sympathetic to the surrounding setting. This has also been secured by condition. Additionally, the installation of a biomass boiler is to facilitate cleaner energy for the farmstead.

However, there was a concern from the Environmental Health Officer about the noise that the unit may produce. Other assessments and calculations have been included and considered within the supporting information. As such, it was recommended and conditioned to provide a noise assessment prior to the installation of any equipment.

As such, it is considered that given the sympathetic placement and style of the flue, it would not result in unacceptable harm to neighbouring amenity or the character and appearance of the dwelling or wider area.

Conclusion

In view of the above, it is considered that the proposal adheres to Strategic Policy C and Policy C017 of the Authority's adopted policies, set out within the Local Plan, and is therefore recommended for approval.
