Better, reduces the harm but still appears incongruous projecting beyond the gable end. I would say the gable end should be considered the limit for any extension.

The removal of the wall from the dining room/wc is not appropriate because it is part of the original plan form (evidenced by the symmetrical alcoves flanking the fireplace), and would have separated the original kitchen from scullery/pantry.

The insertion of a pair of windows to the eastern gable would still be harmful to the masonry. If more light is required due to the construction of the en-suite I would suggest moving the existing rooflight eastwards to light the room, and accepting that the en-suite doesn't have natural light. It can still have ventilation via a tile vent.
