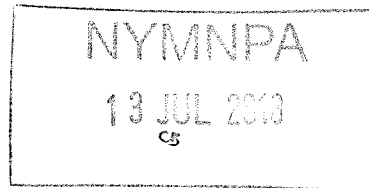

Dear Mrs. Teasdale,

Many thanks for your letter of 02 July 2018, and we very much appreciate being consulted on Common Land planning issues in our area.

As our Defra Common Land mapping shows no incursions onto Common Land in this application, we would have no objections to the project.

The drawn site—redline and the description of the site—differ in that the Public House is included in the written description, but not the Redline plan of the site. We are unable to view the 'plans and elevation pdf.' (page doesn't load), so should any development be taking place within the vicinity of the Public House, and include Common Land, our opinion could differ, and we request that we be kept informed.

We would not normally comment on other than Common Land, but this project appears to be of high quality and a positive addition to the village. For something of this standard to be successful, an upgrade of the Public House would obviously be required and that can only be beneficial to the village.

We look forward to seeing the next stage of the project.
