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The above named Authority being the Planning Authority for the purposes of your application validated 23 April 2015, in respect of proposed development for the purposes of conversion of redundant agricultural buildings to form 1 no. local occupancy unit and 2 no. units with flexible use to include holiday /local occupancy letting and storage space together with associated access and landscaping works at North Bridge Farm, Dwindale Road, Staintondale has considered your said application and has granted permission for the proposed development subject to the following conditions:

1. The development hereby permitted shall be commenced before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

The development hereby permitted shall not be carried out other than in strict



or in accordance with any minor variation thereof that may be approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015 (or any order revoking and re-enacting that Order), no development within Schedule 2, Part 1, Classes A to H Schedule 2, Part 2, Classes A to C and within Schedule 2 Part 14 Classes A to I of that Order shall take place without a further grant of planning permission being obtained from the Local Planning Authority.

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Conditions (Continued)

4. The occupation of the dwelling A hereby permitted shall be limited to:
- i) a qualifying person; and
 - ii) a wife or husband (or person living as such), licensee, dependant or sub-tenant of a qualifying person.

For the purpose of the above, a person is a qualifying person in relation to the dwelling if he/she has an interest in the dwelling (see Note A) and, immediately prior to occupying the dwelling, he/she satisfied the Local Planning Authority that he/she was in need of local needs housing in terms of the criteria set out in Core Policy J of the adopted North York Moors Local Development Framework, namely that he/she:

- a) is currently living in and has permanently resided in the National Park for five years or more and is living in accommodation that no longer meets their requirements or
- b) does not currently live in the National Park but has a strong and long standing link to the local community including a previous period of residence of five years or more or
- c) has an essential need to move to live close to relatives who are currently living in and have resided in the National Park for at least the previous five years or more and require support for reasons of age or infirmity or
- d) requires support for reasons of age or infirmity and need to move to live close to relatives who are currently living and have resided in the National Park for at least the previous five years or more or
- e) needs to live in the National Park as a result of current sole employment within that parish or adjacent parishes within the National Park.


Prior to the occupation of the development the qualifying person shall have obtained confirmation in writing from the Authority that they satisfy the local need criteria outlined in points a - e above.

Note A: For the purposes of the above, a person has an interest in the dwelling if he/she has a freehold or leasehold interest in the whole or any part of it, or is a secure tenant or statutory tenant within the meaning of the Housing Act 1985 or the Rent Act 1977.

Note B: For the purposes of the above, resident within the National Park will include the whole of parishes split by the National Park boundary with the following exceptions; Allerston, Beadlam, Burniston, East Ayton, East Harlsey, Ebberston and Yedingham, Great Ayton, Great and Little Broughton, Great Busby, Guisborough, Ingleby Arncliffe, Irtton, Kirkby in Cleveland, Kirkbymoorside, Lockwood, Nawton, Newby, Pickering, Potto, Scalby, Snainton, Sutton under Whitestonecliffe, West Ayton.

5. The dwelling units B and C hereby approved shall not be used for residential purposes other than holiday letting or local occupancy letting purposes. For the purpose of this condition 'holiday letting' means letting to the same person, group of persons or family for period(s) not exceeding a total of 28 days in any one calendar year and "local occupancy letting" must meet the criteria set out in Condition 4 above.

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Conditions (Continued)

6. The holiday/local occupancy letting units hereby permitted shall form and remain part of the curtilage of Dwelling A hereby approved and shall not be sold or leased off from the main dwelling or let off except as holiday/local letting accommodation in accordance with the terms of condition 5 above without a further grant of planning permission from the Local Planning Authority.
7. No external lighting shall be installed in the development hereby permitted until details of lighting have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The lighting shall be installed in accordance with the details so approved and shall be maintained in that condition in perpetuity.
8. Prior to commencement of work on the scheme hereby approved a schedule of historic timbers within Building A is to be submitted for the written approval of the Local Planning Authority detailing the current positions of historic timbers within the structure and proposed locations for reuse if they are not retained in situ. Thereafter the works shall be carried out in strict accordance with the schedule approved.
9. This permission has been granted in accordance with the details specified in the survey prepared by R.O. Birdsall MSc MICE Chartered Engineer received on 21 April 2015. More extensive works of demolition and rebuilding that does not accord with these details may render the permission invalid and may require a further grant of planning permission from the Local Planning Authority.
10. All new stonework and roofing tiles used in the development hereby permitted shall match those of the existing building, including the colour and texture of the stone and the method of coursing, pointing, jointing and mortar mix unless otherwise agreed with the Local Planning Authority.
11. Any re-pointing in the development hereby permitted shall accord with the following specification - a lime mortar mix of 1:2½ (lime; sand (sand mix of 50% sieved sharp sand and 50% builder's sand) with a slightly recessed bagged finish.
12. The rooflights to be installed in the development hereby permitted shall be a conservation style rooflight unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.
13. All new window frames, glazing bars, external doors and door frames shall be of timber construction and shall be maintained in that condition in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.
14. All new window frames, glazing bars and external doors and door frames shall be of timber construction, stained dark brown (or other colour if approved by the Local Planning Authority) within six months of the date of installation and shall be maintained in that condition in perpetuity, unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.
15. The guttering to the development hereby permitted shall be directly fixed to the stonework by means of gutter spikes with no fascia boarding being utilised in the development and shall thereafter be so maintained in that condition in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.

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
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Conditions (Continued)

16. The rainwater goods utilised in the development hereby permitted shall be coloured black and shall thereafter be so maintained in that condition in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.
17. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, there shall be no excavation or other groundworks, except for investigative works, or the depositing of material on the site until the access(es) to the site have been set out and constructed in accordance with the published Specification of the Highway Authority and the following requirements
 - a. The crossing of the highway verge and/or footway shall be constructed in accordance with the approved details and/or Standard Detail number E9A
 - b. Provision to prevent surface water from the site/plot discharging onto the existing or proposed highway shall be constructed and maintained thereafter to prevent such discharges
 - c. The final surfacing of any private access within 6 metres of the public highway shall not contain any loose material that is capable of being drawn on to the existing or proposed public highway.All works shall accord with the approved details unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority.
18. No dwelling shall be occupied until the related parking facilities have been constructed in accordance with the approved drawings. Once created these parking areas shall be maintained clear of any obstruction and retained for their intended purpose at all times.
19. No work shall commence to clear the site in preparation for the development hereby permitted until full details of the hardsurfacing to be utilised on the site have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, including a timetable to implement the proposed works. The hard landscaping works shall then be implemented in accordance with the approved details. The hard landscaping shall be maintained in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority.
20. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the mitigation measures set out in paragraphs 7.1 of the submitted Bat Survey dated 21 June 2015.
21. Prior to the commencement of any works to the buildings which are the subject of this application, the buildings must be surveyed by a licensed barn owl worker. The findings of the survey, together with mitigation measures for the protection of barn owls and any roosts, shall be submitted to an approved in writing. The development hereby permitted shall thereafter be carried out in accordance with the mitigation measures approved.

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
Informatives

1. In relation to condition 17 you are advised that a separate licence will be required from the Highway Authority in order to allow any works in the adopted highway to be carried out. The 'Specification for Housing and Industrial Estate Roads and Private Street Works' published by North Yorkshire County Council, the Highway Authority, is available at the County Council's offices. The local office of the Highway Authority will also be pleased to provide the detailed constructional specification referred to in this condition.
2. You are advised that prior to the commencement of development hereby approved, a separate European Protected Species Licence, will be required from Natural England.

Reasons for Conditions

1. To ensure compliance with Sections 91 to 94 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended.
2. For the avoidance of doubt and to ensure that the details of the development comply with the provisions of NYM Core Policy A and NYM Development Policy 3, which seek to conserve and enhance the special qualities of the NYM National Park.
3. In order to enable the Local Planning Authority to retain control over future alterations to the property in the interests of safeguarding the existing form and character of the building in line with NYM Development Policy 3 and NYM Core Policy A, which seek to enhance and conserve the special qualities of the NYM National Park and secure high quality design for new development.
4. In order to comply with NYM Core Policy J which seeks to restrict the occupancy of new residential development to those with a local links and an essential need to live in the locality.
5. The site is in a location where new residential development would be contrary to NYM Core Policy J but permission for holiday accommodation has been permitted to ensure that a traditional rural building is conserved in line with NYM Development Policy 8.
6. The site is in a location where the occupation of the accommodation hereby permitted as a separate independent dwelling unit would be contrary to NYM Core Policies B and J.
7. In order to comply with the provisions of NYM Core Policy A which seeks to ensure that new development does not detract from the quality of life of local residents.
8. In order to ensure that any features of historic and/or architectural interest are adequately recorded prior to development commencing on site and to comply with NYM Development Policy 7, which seeks to ensure that historic remains are recorded.
9. In order to ensure that the development is carried out in a manner which safeguards the existing fabric of the building and to comply with the provisions of NYM Development Policy 5.

- 11. Policy A and NYM Development Policy 3 which seek to ensure that building materials are of a high quality and compatible with the character of the locality and that the special qualities of the National Park are safeguarded.
- 12 - For the avoidance of doubt and in order to comply with the provisions of NYM Core
- 16. Policy A and NYM Development Policy 3 which seek to ensure that the appearance of the development is compatible with the character of the locality and that the special qualities of the National Park are safeguarded.
- 17. In accordance with NYM Development Policy 23 and to ensure a satisfactory means of access to the site from the public highway in the interests of vehicle and pedestrian safety and convenience.
- 18. In accordance with NYM Development Policy 23 and to provide for adequate and satisfactory provision of off-street accommodation for vehicles in the interest of safety and the general amenity of the development.
- 19. In the interests of the satisfactory appearance of the development and in order to comply with the provisions of NYM Development Policy 3 which seeks to ensure that development proposals incorporate suitable hard landscaping details.
- 20 - To ensure protection of a species protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act
- 21. and compliance with NYM Core Policy C which seeks to conserve and enhance the quality and diversity of the natural environment.

Explanation of how the Authority has Worked Positively with the Applicant/Agent
