A pedestrian footpath travels around the application site and as such any alterations to the building will be clearly visible. Due to the steep topography of the settlement the roofscape of the side extension and gable of the main house above are both prominent in the approach from the rear. Although the extension roof tiles are not traditionally detailed and therefore of minimal aesthetic appeal the tapering extension roof and coursed sandstone gable abutting this with its small offset window combine to create a very charming piece of streetscape. The low ridge of the extension also provides views across the extension roof to an attractive pantile roofscape beyond whilst the stepped building height helps absorb the significant height differentiation between the house and the steps connecting the front and rear alleys. The proposed extension will conceal the attractive views of the gable and roofscape beyond and create a high extension gable of a much less human scale than the existing which will have an overbearing effect on people using the steps. Finally whilst the existing extension is pleasantly asymmetrical and 'quirky' the proposed extension will create a severely asymmetric roof line which is un-typical of the Conservation Area and aesthetically displeasing. No public benefits have been put forward to mitigate the harm that will be caused to the character of the conservation area as required by para 134 of the NPPF and as such refusal is recommended, BD
