Thanks for that, Hilary.

I still think this seems to be an increase in the volume of manure that could potentially enter the watercourse, either during a flood event or just any sort of accidental release. I attach an email about new rules on fertiliser and manure use and storage which show that the EA is very aware of the pollution risks of agricultural management. The new buildings appear to be less than 10m from the river, so intensification in this sort of situation could be the sort of bad practice that the EA wishes to reduce. However, to help assess the actual risk and significance of that increase here, I'd appreciate seeing what EA colleagues say re water quality and biodiversity before replying.

In addition, Elspeth has noticed that the more northerly of the two new buildings appears to replace an existing small outbuilding/barn. We think the photos on MVM are of this building which could have bat interest and so a bat scoping survey should be carried out.
