I see that the EA have responded re flooding, but not water quality. If the application is approved, I would urge that the following is conditioned (Simon Hirst's text):

Utmost care should be taken when working adjacent to the watercourse to prevent soil, silt, oil or any other polluting matter from entering the watercourse. We recommend that a detailed method statement is drawn up and mitigation measures are put in place for pollution prevention before works commence.

Simon will be able to send you the Environment Agency Pollution Prevention Guidelines 5 which should also help.

I am concerned that a livestock building so close to Black Beck, a tributary of the River Derwent, could place this important river at increased risk of water pollution and sedimentation, especially since it is at risk of flooding. There are records of the highly threatened and specially protected white-clawed crayfish downstream in the main river and further downstream the river is an SSSI and SAC which sedimentation is currently damaging.

Please can you let me see the EA response when it arrives, although I won't be able to respond until at least 19 September when I return from holiday.
