Background

Hern Head House Farm comprises a much altered farmhouse with an adjacent group of traditional stone and pantile agricultural outbuildings. The property is located in an isolated location, accessed from the road that leads from Snainton, through Troutsdale to Hackness. The access is a single track lane that leads onto this farmstead. Glimpses of the farm are seen through the trees as you look down towards the site form the higher sections of the Troutsdale road.

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This application seeks full planning permission to construct a single story extension at the front of the house to provide a new kitchen and utility facilities. The extension would partly replace an existing poor quality front extension.

The extension would have be constructed of stone to match the host dwelling, with a flat roof with parapet and lantern roof and would be stepped in from the existing front gable.

Main Issues

Development Policy 3 seeks to maintain and enhance the distinctive character of the National Park by ensuring that the siting, layout and density of development preserves or enhances views into and out of the site; that the scale, height, massing and design are compatible with surrounding buildings; that the standards of design are high; that there is satisfactory landscaping and that the design takes into account the safety, security and access needs for all potential users of the development.

Development Policy 19 of the LDF states that proposals for extensions or alterations to dwellings, or other development within the domestic curtilage will only be supported where the scale, height, form position and design does not detract from the character of the original dwelling and its setting; the development does not adversely affect the amenities of neighbouring occupiers and that annex accommodation is ancillary to the main dwelling.

The proposed extension would replace an existing poor quality extension and due to the parapet roof design, would be subservient in scale to the host dwelling, and be in keeping with its character. Whilst the dwelling is visible from the road above, the proposed extension would not be visible from the vantage point and would not be visually intrusive in the immediate or wider landscape.

In view of the above the proposal is in accordance with DP3 and DP19 and consequently, approval is recommended.
