

Dear Sir or Madam.

In the very near future I am going to have to decide whether to reinvest in the pig unit that we currently run, which provides my son and I with our main income. If we decide to go down this route it will mean carrying on in pig farming for possibly the next 20 years or so at least.

One of my hobbies is Siberian Husky trekking. This is a very enjoyable hobby and one that the more I have thought about it, could have promising commercial possibilities.

I would like to create a Siberian Husky Experience open to the public, where people could come and learn about the origins of the breed and participate in some Husky trekking activities. The Husky trekking would be run on a strictly pre-booked basis, and by doing it this way, it would not create any increase in local traffic.

The amount of dogs that I would keep would be around 12, Incidently though, they would hardly make any noise as they have been described by The Kennel Club of Great Britain as a "mute breed", meaning no disturbances for local residents, they are also renowned for being very friendly towards people as they have lived and worked side by side with humans for centuries having been bred by the Chukchi people of Siberia to be a very successfull sled dog, so pulling is second nature to them. The dogs would be securely housed in our existing barn, all 12 dogs would create 5 or 6 teams of 2 dogs to each customer. The rig they pull is quite a recent invention, please find enclosed a couple of photographs of a pair of Huskies pulling a Husky scooter, exactly the thing we would be using. They are no bigger than a pushbike, and the dogs pull them at a speed of about 10-12 mph. All customers would be provided with the correct safety equipment when Husky trekking.

I would create a ring fence circuit in one of our fields that would allow us to instruct, and then let people enjoy the thrill of being pulled along by the Huskies around the perimeter of the field. We would occasionally like to be able to use the old railway line for the more competent Trekkers, this would not create any disturbance as it would be no different to somebody riding their pushbikes with a dog trutting by their side, even less so in fact, as the Huskys are restrained on their harnesses and not running freely. I think this would create a reliable

business for us to gain an income from. Also, if it proved successful, would probably, if my projections of income are correct, allow me to reduce the amount of pigs we keep and eventually stop pig farming altogether. Each "team" of dogs would be able to complete 2 to 3 runs a day, so the maximum number of customers per day would be between 12 and 15 people. Meaning probably only about half a dozen cars in any one day, so there would obviously be no traffic problems created.

It is a business that would be very unobtrusive and quiet and would not alter the landscape. It would be no different to cycling or "walking the dog" so to speak. If it allowed us to wind down the pig farm side of our business it would benefit the area generally because it would end the smell that slurry spreading creates.
