

## Re: NYM/2008/0659/FL

Application for replacement storage/stable and associated change of use of part of paddock into domestic curtilage at **Tamarind**, **Church Lane Fylingthorpe**.

At the recent meeting of the Fylingdales Parish Council, 21 October 2009, concerns were expressed about the course of development at the property named above, Tamarind, Church Lane, Fylingthorpe.

The Council can recall the passage of the application through the chamber, in September 2008, and are mindful of notes of caution raised at that time. These were reactivated when representations were made to the council by Mr Paul Abbott, of Inglenook, Church Lane, Fylingthorpe. Mr Abbott, whose property borders that of Tamarind, brought his concerns to the attention of the council, by phone and in person at the October meeting. He had followed the undertakings on the site and listed observations made and anxieties raised. The council is informed by Mr Abbott, that he has approached NYMNPA directly with this same information.




I am instructed by the council, to encourage and press the Parks Authority to exercise the closest scrutiny to monitor developments to ensure permissible development on this site.

Firstly, I acknowledge receipt of your email Wed 11/11/09 Letter from Mike McCabe re: Clarification of intended use of new building

Please find below the response from the Parish Council to the Minor Amendment Tamarind, Church Lane, Fylingthorpe.

I confirm your deadline was 15<sup>th</sup> November, Sunday, and your agreement by telephone this week that NYMNPA would expect to open and respond to FPC email on Monday 16 Nov 09.

The Parish Council does not support the plans for "Non-material amendments".

The Parish Council is of the opinion that the building we supported is now: of a different size, in a different place, for a different purpose and with different sized rooms. Perhaps National Parks could explain how this is a minor amendment? Had this proposal come before us we would not have supported it. The reasoning behind erecting the building in the paddock was to stable a horse. Without stabling for a horse the building could and should be within the main garden. The applicant runs a building company and it is difficult to comprehend how a building could be erected in the wrong place by accident.
