I wish to register my concerns that the Flood Risk Assessment regarding the proposed development at Tomorand, Old Church Lane, Fylingthorpe has not been investigated by a qualified relevant engineer.

On the 7th August 2010 I organised a site visit. Reluctantly Building Control Manager Dave Todd, Tom Pogett of the Environment Agency, Riverside Design Mike McCabe and "others" met residents from all six affected houses. It was obvious the Government Agencies were on a realisation mission. Unfortunately none of these agencies have lodged a report on the NYMNP Planning Website. WHY??

Springs were pointed out. They discovered numerous drainage pipes already laid. Unyet

huge volumes of water still exist. WHY?

Riverside Design admitted Tamorind is built on a bed of sand. Explaining why it had to be built on a concrete raft.

The word RAFT is a warning! Relevant definition of a raft is a thick slab of reinforced concrete laid over soft ground to provide foundations for a building. SUCH A STRUCTURE COMPRESSING ALREADY SATURATED GROUND COULD DIVERT WATER COURSES

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Sand beds should benefit drainage. Agencies failed to explain the flooding evidence.

Not one Government Agency or Applicant has submitted objective analysis. No professional engineer engaged. NOT EVEN A SUB SOIL SURVEY CARRIED OUT. Yorkshire Water have imposed a 3 litres/second benchmark. How big will the holding tank be??

Where does the surplus water go?

Riverside Design claim. there is no evidence of landslip risk. May I remind you Riverside Design claimed there was no record of flooding. Photographic evidence proved Flood Risk was an issue. Known by the applicant what else has not been declared.

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
Each Government Agency has categorically stated the present flooding is not their problem. Not one will accept responsibility to an acknowledged dangerous situation. Until the current problem(s) are resolved no further development should be allowed.

THE FLOOD RISK IS EVIDENT. The danger is Fylingthorpe will have a stream flowing down Old Church Lane. Freezing weather will create treacherous conditions on footpath and road as water seeps through steps, retaining walls and kerbs. Surely an Health & Safety matter.

Once the underground stream, springs and surface water reaches a public thoroughfare then YORKSHIRE WATER and ENVIRONMENT AGENCY are officially involved & responsible. TOO LATE!

I urge you to reject Tomorrow's Planning Application
