Design and Access Statement

The Site

The site is situated within the curtilige of Raincliffe Barn to the North of Scarborough town centre. Raincliffe Barn is a Listed Building which has been converted into a dwelling. The barn is constructed from stone with a pantile roof.

The proposal is to erect a garden shed/store built of timber with a pantile roof.

Consultation
