Description

Lavender Cottage is situated on the right hand side as you enter Broxa. The land to which the detached garage is proposed to be built, is to the rear of the cottage

Existing Design

There were numerous timber & metal outbuildings that were deemed unsafe after the harsh winter of 2010/2011. These were used for storage of Mrs Taylor's car, together with the storage of various equestrian apparel & gardening equipment.

Enclosed are photographs of the buildings prior to removal.

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Proposed Design

The proposed design will be built in similar stonework to the front elevation to match the outbuildings in the surrounding vicinity. It is proposed top build both the sides & the rear walls in block work & render. This will then be painted in a sandstone masonry paint to compliment the stonework. The rood will be covered in non-interlocking pan tiles that have been reclaimed from the various redundant outbuildings within the village.

The scale and appearance will match the surrounding properties, so as not to cause a detrimental impact on the street-scene.
