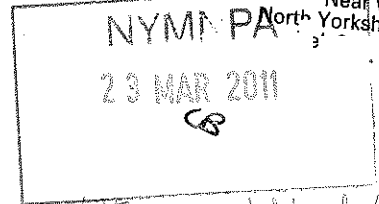

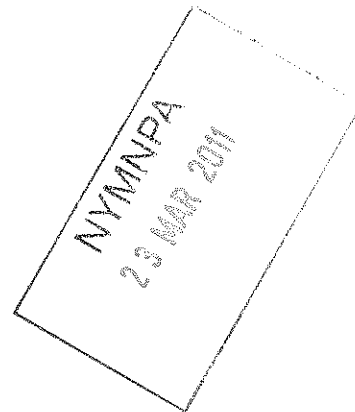

**Application for change of use of land to form overflow car park at land adjacent Robin Hoods Surgery.  
Grid reference 505350.**

Dear Mrs Saunders

I wish to object to this change of use of land on the following grounds:

The clinical rooms for Robin Hoods Bay Surgery are all on the side of the building which faces the field. Therefore the access road and the parking bays will be directly next to the clinical area. All of the five clinical rooms will be subject to loss of privacy and excessive noise. The constant movement of cars, opening and closing of doors, slamming of car boots and frequent car alarms will cause severe disruption to this clinical environment. The loss of privacy will require us to keep the windows covered at all times.

We were restricted in how we covered the car parking area in the surgery because of the risk of flooding to the houses in Manor Road and because the local drainage system is already at maximum load. Any further surfacing work in that field will add to that problem.

When we built the surgery we were informed that the field was to be kept for future development into a graveyard and that the land had been purchased by the Church for this purpose.

The Station car park is already very busy and this extra area of parking will add to the traffic flows and potential danger of collisions.

Thank you for the Notification about the proposed planning application for Change of use to the rear of my property. And apologies for the late response

I **strongly oppose** the change of use to that of a car park. Manor road is a small cul-de-sac, the main of the people on the road are elderly. My property along with several others backs directly on to the field.

If the proposed application was to be allowed it would result in a lot more noise, as you are aware robin hoods bay is quite popular, and the potential for sixty seven cars parking next to my and others back garden can only result in Increased noise, along with litter, etc. And would like to Know how it could only be used between the hours proposed?

Allowing the car park at the rear of manor road would also drive down the prices of the property in that area in what is already a depressed market.

I also have concerns about the ability of the drainage system should we experience heavy rain. As this can already be a problem as the back gardens are lower than the field.

The noise of people shouting, car doors being slammed etc from the station road car park can already be quite an invasion of our peace and quite.. To allow that disturbance to move closer would be wrong. And I am sure against your own policies.

The lack of parking spaces has being a problem in RHBay for a long time now. And could have being addressed at the time of the latest sea wall development. That land could have being used, and still could with probably not much more work than is proposed for the land at the rear of Manor road.

As at the moment it is mainly used as a dog's toilet.

The land North of the Station road car park would also be more suitable, and permanent. There are several more suitable places in the bay to site a car park.

The only winners if the development is given the go ahead is **SBC**.

And as this is not permanent, I believe our privacy and quality of life should not be sacrificed for short term gain no matter who it is.

Please ask the planning panel / committee this question. Would you want it so close to you? Please do the right thing, and refuse planning.

**Re: Application for change of use of land to form overflow car park at land adjacent to Robin Hood's Bay Surgery – Grid Reference 505350**

I am writing on behalf of Whitby Group Practice to object to the above planning application for change of use of land next to our surgery at Robin Hood's Bay.

We are concerned that the GP and Dental consulting rooms are all on the side of the building which would be near to and face directly on to the proposed car park and the main access to the car park.

We feel our clinical rooms would be directly looked on and that a car park here would lead to a loss of privacy and compromise confidentiality. We feel it would be disruptive to patient consultations as a result of noise from cars entering and leaving and parking, with cars starting their engines and the closing of car doors and slamming of car boots. We feel that we would have no option but to keep windows and blinds closed and that this could create an uncomfortable environment in the clinical rooms. When the surgery was built we specifically planned for the clinical rooms to face the field as our understanding was that the field's eventual use would be for a future expansion of the graveyard.

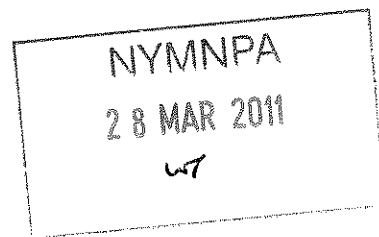
We have concerns about drainage and the risk of flooding, particularly to properties on Manor Road, which was highlighted to us when the surgery was first built and our requirement for a gravelled surface car park.

Hello there.

I hope i am not too late to object slightly to the application by the council to change the church field into a car park.

I live next to the church field at Rookery Nook, station road, robin hood's bay and so we will be clearly surrounded by cars if this field is to be a car park.

This part of the village has always been considered a "sensitive area" and we hope this has not been overlooked to date.

Firstly i would like to say that the drainage needs to be carefully looked at if the surface is to be hard standing. This has always been a problem in this location so needs some careful consideration. I believe you can buy concrete block which grass grows through or pebbles but drainage is an issue here as water runs from the side banks of the main car park down into this area and this happens with only slightest of rain not serious downfalls.

Secondly could this car park be gated and only be used at certain busy times of the year so that the main visitor car park seems the norm. The field could then be offered at bank holiday and busy holiday times only so suit visitors needs.

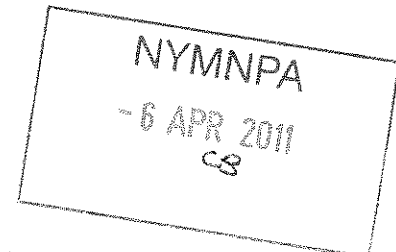

Dear Sirs,

I am writing to object to the proposed change of use from a meadow to an overflow car park off Station Road, Robin Hood's Bay.

The meadow in question abuts the private road in which I live.

The Village Surgery is located to the left of the field. Surely it is the right of anyone visiting the surgery to be assured total Patient-Doctor confidentiality. This would be in jeopardy with the possibility of vehicles and passengers parking to a proposed boundary fence. This is unacceptable. Why should consultations be held behind closed blinds to ensure privacy.

From a general view, at peak times traffic causes chaos in the village. The village is visitor saturated. The access to and from Station Road is poor at the best of times. Access to the surgery is often restricted, causing problems which will be aggravated should
