TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN

1 Location and Access to the Site

- 1.1 The works are located approximately 680m north of the 'Redgates' junction on the B1416, adjacent to Honeysuckle Farm. A new access will be formed to gain entry to the drill site from the B1416. The vehicle route will be via the B1416 and the A171 to the south. The approved traffic route for vehicles entering and exiting the site is shown on the attached plan, numbered 12015/005A.
- 1.2 The contractor shall ensure that his workforce, sub-contractors and suppliers are aware of the approved traffic route. This route shall be used at the specified times by site vehicles and no other access routes shall be used.
- 1.3 Temporary road traffic signage is also shown on the attached plan. This signage scheme shall be erected prior to the commencement of the works and maintained as necessary for the duration of the contract. The signs shall then be removed at the end of the contract. All signage will be in accordance with Traffic Signs Manual Chapter 8 and the TSR & GD. None of the temporary signs shall be sited to obscure the existing permanent signs or sited where existing signs will obscure them.

2 Traffic Control

- 2.1 If the Contractor elects to limit Heavy Goods Vehicles traffic servicing the site to specific times of the working day, or is required to do so by reason of conditions imposed by the Planning Authorities, the contractor shall ensure that no deliveries at the site are received outside those times. Traffic Control shall not be required outside times when HGV movements are permitted.
- 2.2 All suppliers shall be informed of these delivery times and shall expect rigid reinforcement, such penalty for non-compliance being a ban from carrying out further deliveries to the site. In the case of persistent breaches of imposed delivery times, the contractor will be considered to be in breach of the contract.
- 2.3 Particular care must be taken to ensure that no deposits of mud, stones or other matter is allowed to remain on the public highway and provision must be made for the removal of such deposits. Provision must be made for cleaning and keeping clean wheels of all vehicles as necessary.
