Design, Access and Heritage Statement Foulsyke Farm

Mr and Mrs Roache recently purchased the above farm which dates back to the 16th Century, and is constructed of stone walls, timber windows and the roof is partly slate and partly pantiles. The previous owners converted the outbuildings into holiday cottages. These buildings had become unsuitable for modern day farming.

The farm covers some 200 acres of grass, moorland and some trees and is predominately a beef farm with suckler cows, calves and followers.

Mr and Mrs Roche would like to construct on the southerly elevation a timber conservatory with a lower wall constructed in stone to match the existing dwelling. The roof would also be constructed of timber with glass panels. The timber used would be hardwood and then be painted to match the house. The floor would be concrete with top surface of tiles or stone flags.
