- The appeal is made under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 against a refusal to grant planning permission.
- The appeal is made by Rita Nolan and Megan Moreland against the decision of North York Moors National Park.
- The application Ref NYM/2007/0766, dated 4 September 2007, was refused by notice dated 5 November 2007.
- The development proposed is the erection of a conservatory.

Decision

1. I dismiss the appeal.

Main issue

2. The main issue is the effect on the appearance of the existing dwelling and on the character of the local area.

Reasons

- 3. Although the proposed conservatory would be attached to the rear elevation of Ravenscroft it would be clearly visible from a number of nearby rear garden areas. Consequently when built the conservatory would have a significant impact on the character of the area around the rear of this group of houses. In view of this it is reasonable to expect that the conservatory pays careful regard to the scale of the host property.
- 4. In my judgement, however, the proposed conservatory is overly large given the modest scale of Ravenscroft. As a result the conservatory would dominate its rear elevation to an unacceptable extent and would fail to blend in with the existing. The design of the proposal, with its multitude of glazing bars and extensive roof, would accentuate the disharmony. In reaching this view I am mindful that nearby rear extensions do not project out as far as the appeal proposal and as a result do not appear disproportionate.
- 5. The proposed scheme would have a detrimental impact on the appearance of the existing dwelling and detract from the character of the local area. In view of this the proposal is contrary to the objectives of *Policy H8* of the *North York Moors Local Plan*. None of the other matters raised, including the extant

permission for a smaller conservatory or the lack of local objection, outweigh the considerations that have led to my decision.
