- The appeal is made under section 20 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 against a refusal to grant listed building consent.
- The appeal is made by Mr & Mrs I Harrison against the decision of the North York Moors National Park.
- The application, ref. NYM/2008/0354/LB, dated 29 April 2008, was refused by notice dated 26 June 2008.
- The works proposed are a corner infill extension and the formation of internal openings.

Summary of decision: I allow the appeal and grant listed building consent in the terms set out in the formal decision below.

- The appeal is made under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 against a refusal to grant planning permission.
- The appeal is made by Mr & Mrs I Harrison against the decision of the North York Moors National Park.
- The application, ref. NYM/2008/0353/FL, dated 29 April 2008, was refused by notice dated 26 June 2008.
- The development proposed is a corner infill extension.

Summary of decision: I allow the appeal and grant planning permission in the terms set in the formal decision out below. NYMNPA

Main issue

1. The main issue is the same in both appeals – whether the proposed extension would have a harmful effect on the architectural and historic character of the grade II listed building, a farm range now converted into two dwellings.

Reasons

2. The building is a three-sided range, with a regular design at first glance but actually asymmetric. That stems from the easterly and westerly wings, both lower than the two-storey central range, being themselves of different heights and also from the junctions between the wings and the central building being different. The north-eastern corner is a simple right angle. At the north-westerly corner, however, the gables of the westerly wing and the central range abut only corner-to-corner. It may have been this lack of an internal connection that prompted the lean-to extension within the courtyard as part of the conversion, something which looks less a natural part of the complex than that in the north-easterly corner.

Decisions

- 10. I allow appeal ref. APP/W9500/E/08/2085375 and grant listed building consent for a corner infill extension and the formation of internal openings at Foxhill Paddocks, Low Road, Throxenby, Scarborough, YO12 5TD, in accordance with the terms of the application, ref. NYM/2008/0354/LB dated 29 April 2008, and the plans submitted with it, subject to the following conditions.
 - 1) The works hereby authorised shall begin not later than three years from the date of this consent.
 - 2) The materials to be used in the construction of the external surfaces of the extension hereby permitted shall match those used in the existing building; for the avoidance of doubt, the masonry style and pointing shall be in accordance with a sample panel which shall first have been built on the site and approved in writing by the local planning authority and the roof cladding shall be reclaimed natural clay pantiles unless the local planning authority gives its written consent for an alternative.
 - 3) All windows and external doors included in the extension hereby permitted shall be constructed and installed in accordance with details at a scale of not less than 1:20 which have first been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority.
- 11. I allow appeal ref. APP/W9500/A/08/2085376 and grant planning permission for a corner infill extension at Foxhill Paddocks, Low Road, Throxenby, Scarborough, YO12 5TD, in accordance with the terms of the application, ref. NYM/2008/0353/FL dated 29 April 2008, and the plans submitted with it, subject to the following conditions.
 - 1) The development hereby permitted shall begin not later than three years from the date of this decision.
 - 2) The materials to be used in the construction of the external surfaces of the extension hereby permitted shall match those used in the existing building; for the avoidance of doubt, the masonry style and pointing shall be in accordance with a sample panel which shall first have been built on the site and approved in writing by the local planning authority and the roof cladding shall be reclaimed natural clay pantiles unless the local planning authority gives its written consent for an alternative.
 - 3) All windows and external doors included in the development hereby permitted shall be constructed and installed in accordance with details at a scale of not less than 1:20 which have first been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority.
