The above named Authority being the Planning Authority for the purposes of your application registered 20 August 2010, in respect of proposed development for the purposes of installation of solar pv panels on southern elevation of Dalby Visitor Centre together with solar pv panels on south east facing roofslope of units 3/4/5 the Courtyard and solar pv panels on south west facing roofslope of Community Resource building and installation of 11 square metres of heritage solar slates on cafe building at Dalby Courtyard, Low Dalby, Pickering have considered your said application and have granted permission for the proposed development subject to the following condition(s):

- 1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.
- The development hereby approved shall be only carried out in strict accordance with the detailed specifications and plans comprised in the application hereby approved or in accordance with any minor variation thereof that may be approved by the Local Planning Authority.
- 3. If the use of the solar equipment hereby approved permanently ceases within 5 years from the date on which the development was substantially completed, the solar panels and tiles shall be removed from the buildings and the buildings shall, so far as is practicable, be restored to their condition before development took place unless the Local Planning Authority has otherwise agreed in writing.

#### Informatives

- 1. All bats and their roosts are fully protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000) and are further protected under Regulation 39(1) of the Conservation (Natural Habitats &c.) Regulations 1994. Should any bats or evidence of bats be found prior to or during development particularly for roof works mid April to mid October, work must stop immediately and Natural England contacted on 01904 435500 for further advice. This is a legal requirement under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) and applies to whoever carries out the work. All contractors on site should be made aware of this requirement and given Natural England's contact details.
- 2. All species of birds, their nests and eggs are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (amended). Under this legislation it is an offence to:
  - Intentionally kill, injure or take any wild bird;
  - Intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built;
  - Intentionally take or destroy the egg of any wild bird.
