The above named Authority being the Planning Authority for the purposes of your application registered 5 December 2011, in respect of proposed development for the purposes of **construction of a multi user trail** at **Ellerburn, Low Dalby** has considered your said application and has **granted** permission for the proposed development subject to the following condition(s):

- 1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.
- 2. The development hereby permitted shall not be carried out other than in accordance with the application plans as amended by the plans received by the National Park Authority on 27 March 2012 and the email received on 17 April 2012, or in accordance with any minor variation thereof that may be approved by the Local Planning Authority.
- 3. No trees, shrubs or hedges on or adjacent to the proposed trail shall be felled, uprooted, wilfully damaged or destroyed, cut back or removed without the prior written consent of the Local Planning Authority. Any work approved shall be carried out in accordance with British Standard 5837 (2012) Recommendations for Tree Work. If any retained tree/hedge is removed, uprooted, destroyed or dies within five years of the completion of the development, it shall be replaced with trees, shrubs or hedge plants of a similar size and species, unless the Local Planning Authority gives written consent to any variation.
- 4. Prior to the commencement of the development a Method Statement shall be submitted to the National Park Authority for approval, it should contain details of:
 - a. The exact position, size and design of the proposed interpretation panels, structures, fences and benches.
 - b. The exact position of the trail layout and the precise extent of clearings together with details of all vegetation and trees proposed to be removed.
 - c. Measures for the protection of those trees to be retained during the course of the development.
 - d. The materials to be used on the surface of the trail.
 - e. All other hard surfacing features, including minor artefacts and structures, any furniture, refuse or other storage units, signs and external lighting.
 - f. Fencing details.
 - g. Details of specimen trees to be planted along the eastern boundary of the route to enhance assimilation into the wider landscape.
