2 dwellings in 3 builds. Early-mid C19. Coursed squared stone. Roof part slate, part concrete pantiles. Two storeys. At left the larger house of 4 bays has hip-ended roof and two stone stacks. Sash windows mostly with glazing bars. Louvred shutters. Half-glazed door with oblong fanlight in prostyle Doric porch. Lower part to north is of 2 bays, also having sash windows with glazing bars, and there is an outhouse range to north of this, from which a coped stone wall runs eastward along the road boundary.

Church. 1896 dated on foundation stone. Coursed squared stone. Roof renewed in concrete tiles. Cruciform without aisles. North transept tower, north porch and vestry. Apsidal chancel. Paired lancet windows, stepped buttresses. Battlemented tower with round projecting stair turret. Stepped lancet west window. Good oak door. Interior: stone and smooth plaster. Ornamental crown-post roof. High-quality painted glass: west window by W F Curtis Ward and Hughes, 1905, also some lancets. Other windows by Shrigley & Hunt. Good oak choir stalls and communion rail. OSBM on tower base.
