Whitby Park & Ride Site - EIA Screening Request

As you will recall, North Yorkshire County Council prepared a Traffic Management Strategy for Whitby which was adopted in December 2002. Central to the strategy is a proposal to introduce a Park & Ride Site on the A171 approach to the town. The site is likely operate from 10am to 7pm 7 days per week during the busiest part of the tourist season and at weekends between Easter and the end of October. This will provide significant relief to traffic congestion in the town centre during the tourist season with consequential benefits for pedestrians and other vulnerable road users as well as quality of life and economic benefits.

The preferred location for the Park & Ride Site is on the north west corner of the junction of the A171 Guisborough Road with the B1460 at Cross Butts. This site lies entirely within the North York Moors National Park. The County Council's Yorkshire Coast & Moors Area Committee affirmed the officers view that this the preferred site and resolved at its 14 July 2005 meeting to test the planning position for the site by submitting a planning application.

The Council has appointed consultants to prepare the planning application and supporting documentation. A preliminary meeting has been held with Mark Hill as a result of which the County Council would now wish to seek a screening to determine whether the application will require an Environmental Impact Assessment.

A location plan is enclosed. The site area is approximately 43,000 square metres, of which approximately 15,000 square metres would be surfaced roadways and parking bays (400 spaces), with a further 5,000 square metres of grassland for overflow parking (200 spaces). A small area would be occupied by the facilities building and the remaining areas would be landscaped.

The site is located in an area of open farmland comprising predominantly large arable fields divided by hedgerows with isolated farms and residential properties. The A171 forms the southern boundary of the site with the B1460 on the eastern boundary and Barkers Lane forming the northern boundary. The properties of Victoria Farm Garden Centre, Cross Butts Farm and Cross Butts Stable Restaurant are directly adjacent to the site.

The site would be accessed from the highway network by a new roundabout to be constructed at the junction of the A171 and B1460. The proposed roundabout would straddle the National Park boundary.

The Park and Ride site would provide approximately 400 parking spaces with low level lighting and CCTV required to provide personal and vehicle security. It is anticipated that the facilities on the site would include public toilets, waiting shelters, information boards, and staff rest room. The site would be landscaped. The lighting would only be needed for the early evenings on a few weeks of the year in late October.

No trees would be lost, there would however be a small loss of existing hedgerows and stone boundary walls.

In terms of visual impact on properties, these are predominantly restricted to properties adjacent to or in close proximity to the site. Generally long distance views are restricted to high ground east and south of the site, views are partially screened by existing vegetation, topography and buildings. High ground to the north and west largely screens the views of the sites from these locations. The group of existing buildings (Cross Butts Farm, Victoria Garden Centre) provide effective screening and lessens the impact of a new development in the open countryside. This is particularly relevant to the café building at the Victoria Farm Garden Centre which is already a dominant feature within the landscape.

We are advised that the site has negligible ecological value. There are however signs of an out lying badger sett within the hedgerow on Barkers Lane, although the possibility of a badger being in residence has not been determined. The sett would not be lost to the development. The potential ecological impact of the site would be minimal. The hedgerow that lies on the northern boundary of the site along Barkers Lane is of better ecological quality than surrounding hedgerows. This hedgerow would not be lost to the development.

Although not directly affected by the development, the setting of the Grade II listed buildings at Cross Butts Farm would be compromised. The impact of the proposed Park and Ride site on Cultural Heritage would therefore be 'Neutral' in our view.


Unfortunately, there seem to be very few on this occasion. This is most likely a result of poor recording effort, rather than of a lack of bats.

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Ecological data search for Whitby Park & Ride NZ 875102

Thank you for your request for an ecological data search for the above area.

There are no non-statutory nature conservation sites within your area of search.

The site partially lies within the North York Moors National Park. We do not hold details of national parks therefore if you require further information you should contact National Parks or consult their website http://www.nationalparks.gov.uk/nym_core

Several SINCs lie in close proximity to your search area therefore if you require any information on these these nearby sites please contact me. A full species and habitat map along with a citation is available for all SINC sites in North Yorkshire, however a charge of £25 is levied by the SINC steering group for this data. If you wish to receive a copy of this information for the SINCs identified in this report please contact us.

The Phase I habitat survey highlighted areas of interest including several areas of grassland within the vicinity but there are no areas deemed worthy of target notes in the area.

Our species database included a record of one otter for the area. Please note that a lack of survey information for any particular area or taxonomic group does not necessarily mean that there is no nature conservation interest present and I would therefore recommend that a site survey is carried out in order to assess any ecological interest that might be present before proceeding with any development.

One particular point to bear in mind is that many bridges in North Yorkshire provide good opportunities for bats and support bat roosts. Please consult the

The North & East Yorkshire Ecological Data Centre is the operating name of the North & East Yorkshire Ecological Data Trust Registered Charity No 1075999 North Yorkshire Bat Group regarding this aspect if the proposal is likely to require working close to or within the structure of any bridge. Bats are European Protected Species under the Conservation (Natural Habitats & c.) Regulations 1994. As you are probably aware, should a proposal be likely to affect or disturb bats and/or their roosts and therefore require derogation from the Regulations, a licence application to DEFRA is required in advance of any works commencing. 

DRAINAGE SCHEME LANDSCAPE AND VISUAL ASSESSMENT FOR PROPOSED PARK AND RIDE: GUISBOROUGH ROAD, WHITBY

The Agency has no objections to the proposed drainage scheme but would recommend that the following condition is applied if the scheme is granted permission:

CONDITION: Prior to being discharged into any watercourse, surface water sewer or soakaway system, all surface water drainage from parking areas and hardstandings shall be passed through an oil interceptor installed in accordance with a scheme previously submitted to and approved in writing by the LPA. Roof water shall not pass through the interceptor.

REASON: To prevent pollution of the water environment.

The Agency would also like to give the following informative comments:

The suggested scheme is feasible, subject to adequate flow controls being placed on the attenuation pond to ensure that the required run-off rate of 1.4 litres/sec/ha. is achieved. The enquirer should ensure that the proposed receiving culverts/open watercourses are in satisfactory enough condition to cope with the additional volume being created by the site without increasing flood risk either on the site or to third parties.
