

The following text forms an addendum to the original heritage desk-based assessment produced in respect of a temporary drilling rig at Doves Nest Farm (Cotswold Archaeology report no. 12108).

As a condition of the permitted development an archaeologist was present during the stripping of topsoil and subsoil. Although, no archaeological remains were known to be located within the site this action was undertaken to identify any potential as yet unrecorded remains. The area of the site strip observed by the archaeologist is depicted on the attached plan. The work took place between 7 and 10 November 2012.

No features, finds or deposits of archaeological significance were identified during the works. The soil removed was located next to the stripped area and stockpiled in areas that were not stripped.

If further soil stripping is required at the site an archaeologist will again be present, although current intelligence suggest that it is unlikely that buried archaeological remains would be exposed.
