1. The very visible (obtrusive) nature of the access road and spoilage, much more so than the previous borehole sites is in direct contradiction to C.Fraser's statements about developing the mine site "in an unobtrusive manner". If this is merely the borehole, how much greater when the mine itself is dug?
2. Retrospective planning permission, if granted, devalues the planning process, and gives a signal to developers that they can do what they like. What chance do the NYM Authority have to reverse any unauthorized development once this scheme is underway?
