Further to my original email opposing the above planning application. I would like to remind the planning committee, that in December 1989 when permission was given by the NYM planning authority, for The Everley public house to be converted into eight holiday flats, local people packed Hackness village hall to strenuously voice their opposition to the plan. The Everley then continued as a thriving public house and restaurant, well supported by local residents and holiday makers, until 2011, when a combination of two exceptionally severe winters and other financial problems caused the business to fail. I feel that this shows the importance of this pub to our community, which has been anxiously awaiting the reopening of this popular Public House. I also suspect that the plan to change the premises into a tearoom, may have the eventual aim of turning the Everley into a private residence, thus permanently depriving our community of this important social resource.

I hope that the contents of this email will be read to the planning committee as I am unable to attend in person due to work commitments.
