1. The accommodation hereby approved shall not be used for residential purposes other than holiday letting purposes or for purposes ancillary to the use of the main dwelling known as Baillie Close and the accommodation shall not be occupied as a separate independent dwelling and shall form and shall remain as part of the curtilage of this main dwelling, known as "Baillie Close" as a single planning unit. For the purpose of this condition 'holiday letting' means letting to the same person, group of persons or family for period(s) not exceeding a total of 28 days in any one calendar year

Reasons for Conditions

 The site is in a location where new residential development would be contrary to NYM Core Policy J but permission for holiday accommodation has been permitted to ensure that a traditional rural building is conserved in line with NYM Development Policy 8.
