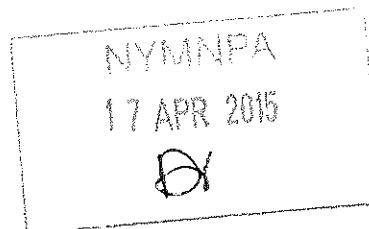

Please find attached amended elevations in line with your recommendations.

The upper door they have selected is one they have seen at their sons flat in Leeds ( 12 storey ! ) where the lower leaf folds in by 100mm to provide trickle vents but provides safety as it does open any wider, while the upper leaf opens in fully if required. They are convinced that this meets building regulations due it being installed on approx 50 flats in Leeds city centre.

Your other points are addressed, colour, reveals, centralization, they are hoping that the extra width of the upper opening can be retained as the existing lintol remains and the increased width is only 150mm ie 75mm each end.
