Statement of Case by the North York Moors National Park Authority as Local Planning
Authority under Rule 6 of the Inquiries Procedure Rules

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1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 This planning inquiry concerns a planning application incorporating gas production, alterations and the provision of new facilities at Ebberston Well site; the construction of two underground gas pipelines from the Ebberston Well site to a proposed gas processing facility to be located off Hurrell Lane, Thornton le Dale; the provision of a new vehicular access road between the A170 and the proposed gas processing facility; and the construction of a gas processing plant to include buildings, plant, and other associated works and infrastructure, the construction of an export pipeline between Hurrell Lane to a proposed National Transmission System Above Ground Installation on land to be located to the south of New Ings Drain, off Hurrell Lane, Thornton le Dale
- 1.2 The planning application was received and validated by the North York Moors National Park Authority on 1st April 2010 and following the appeal by the applicants against non-determination has been recovered by the Secretary of State for his decision.
- 1.3 The North York Moors National Park Authority is the Local Planning Authority (LPA) for the North York Moors National Park. North Yorkshire County Council is the Local Minerals Planning Authority responsible for the adjoining area. The elements of the proposal located within the National Park are the well site and 650 metres of the pipeline. The proposed Gas Processing Plant, Above Ground Installation and new access road are located outside of the National Park.
- 1.4 A report on the proposed development will be considered by the North York Moors National Park Planning Committee on 15th September 2011 which proposes a recommendation to the Secretary of State that the proposal is refused. However this Statement of Case is subject to Members' views and if these prove to be different the Secretary of State will be informed immediately.
- 1.5 Members of the North York Moors National Park Authority's Planning Committee provided formal comments to the element of the proposal which falls outside the National Park to North Yorkshire County Council in July 2011 as part of the formal consultation process.

2.0 Statement of Common Ground

2.1 The Local Planning Authority along with the Minerals Planning Authority will seek to agree with the Appellants as much relevant information as is reasonably possible in a Statement of Common Ground. This is still awaited at present but will be submitted in due course.

3.0 Policy

- 3.1 Reference will be made to the following policies
 - North York Moors Core Strategy and Development Policies adopted November 2008 –
 Core Policy A, Core Policy E and Development Policy 1.
 - Minerals Policy Statement 1 'Planning and Minerals' (2006)
 - Planning Policy Statement 7 'Sustainable Development in Rural Areas'.
 - Planning Policy Statement 22 'Renewable Energy'.'
 - Planning Policy Guidance 24 'Noise'.
 - The Yorkshire and Humber Plan Regional Spatial Strategy to 2026.
 - The North Yorkshire Minerals Local Plan adopted 1997 7/6, 7/7.
 - National Planning Policy Statement for Energy Infrastructure (designated July 2011) –
 overarching EN-1 and gas supply infrastructure and gas and oil pipelines EN-4.
 - National Planning Policy Framework consultation draft published July 2011.
 - English National Park and the Broads UK Government Vision and Circular 2010.

4.0 Planning History

4.1 Natural gas was first discovered lying in the geology of North Yorkshire in the 1940's. Planning Permission was granted at the well site currently being considered in 2008 for the drilling and siting of a temporary borehole and access for exploration, testing and evaluation of hydrocarbons. It was noted in the Committee Report for this application that granting this consent would not be any indication of the possible decision should an application for production be submitted. In December 2010 permission was granted to allow the retention of the well site for a further two years.

5.0 Local Planning Authority Statement of Case

- 5.1 This Statement of Case concerns the particulars of the case which the Local Planning Authority proposes to put forward at the inquiry. It relates to two main areas:
 - The impact on the Local Landscape and the setting of the North York Moors National Park and:
 - The proposed development fails to meet the requirements of the Major
 Development Test as set out in paragraph 14, Minerals Planning Statement 1.
- 5.2 The LPA will put forward evidence to show that although the proposed Gas Processing Plant is located on a site 10 metres away from the boundary of the National Park it will have a significantly adverse impact on the landscape of the North York Moors and it's special qualities of dark skies at night and tranquility. The Local Planning Authority will put forward evidence to counter the Applicant's arguments that the location of the site and the proposed screening will result in no harm to the local landscape or the North York Moors National Park.
- 5.3 Although it is recognised that there is an overall need to exploit viable gas reserves, the LPA will demonstrate that the adverse impact the proposed industrial development will have on the setting of the North York Moors National Park will be so great that the proposal fails to meet the requirements of the Major Development Test set out in paragraph 14, Minerals Planning Statement 1.
- 5.4 The National Park Authority will rely on evidence given by North Yorkshire County Council on other matters to support its putative Reasons for Refusal which are:
 - 1. The applicants have failed to robustly demonstrate that there is significant national need for the gas resources which would outweigh the harm that will be caused to this part of the National Park by the development and is therefore contrary to the Major Development Test set out in paragraph 14, Minerals Policy Statement 1, Core Policy E and the draft National Planning Policy Framework.
 - 2. The applicants have failed to demonstrate that there is a sufficient level of gas resources in the area to justify the construction of a Gas Processing Plant within close proximity to

- the National Park, which will set a precedent and create perhaps irresistible pressure for a number of further well sites within the National Park in as yet unknown locations, which might have a harmful impact on it's character and special qualities and conflicts with Core Policy A.
- 3. The applicants have not provided robust evidence to satisfy the National Park Authority that there will be no safety risks, noise or light emissions from the development, which may adversely impact the residential amenity of nearby residents living in the North York Moors and is therefore contrary to Development Policy 1.
- 4. The proposed Gas Processing Plant will cause significant visual harm to the setting and special qualities including dark skies at night and tranquillity of the North York Moors National Park within the wider landscape when looking from the south and thereby conflicts with Core Policy A, the English National Parks and the Broads Circular 2010 and policies 7/6 and 7/7 of the North Yorkshire Minerals Local Plan.
- 5. It has not been sufficiently demonstrated by the applicant that an alternative site for the proposal could not be both technically and environmentally acceptable as required by paragraph 14, Minerals Policy Statement 1 and Policy 7/7 of the North Yorkshire Minerals Local Plan.
- 6. The applicant has not provided sufficient information with regard to restoration of the land, either post operational life or in the event of abandonment, to satisfy the Authority that a suitable restoration of the site can be achieved or secured, which conflicts with Core Policy A.

6.0 Documents to be Referred to

- 6.1 A Core Document List has been compiled and circulated to all parties and the current draft is attached at Annex A.
- 6.2 The Local Planning Authority reserves the right to refer to other documentation as may be necessary in the development of a Proof of Evidence and in giving evidence at the Inquiry.
